

## Guidelines and Fees

Douglas Harbour is operated by the volunteer members of the Fredericton Yacht Club and while you are welcome to enjoy the beauty of the harbour and use our facilities you are asked to treat it with respect. To partially offset some of the cost of maintaining and operating the facility, the club has established guidelines and levies modest fees for use of some of the facilities.

- FYC moorings for rent are available at a nightly cost of **\$10.00 per day or \$50 per week** payable in cash at the box located in the Welcome building or remitted at Hunter's One Stop.
- Use of the pump out is on a self-serve basis. Instructions for its use are imprinted on the fence surrounding the pump-out. FYC fee of **\$2.00** payable at the cash box or Hunter's One-Stop.
- There is also suggested voluntary fee of **\$2.00** for the use of showers.
- Certain yacht clubs have reciprocal privileges (please check with your home club)

## Other information

**Hunter's One Stop**, a well-stocked convenience store is located half a kilometer from the wharf. Take the wharf road to the cross road intersection then turn right for 250 meters. The store is on the right. This store has gas and diesel, basic foodstuff and other provisions, alcohol products, ice as well as a small laundromat. (A small creek which connects the harbour to the rear of the store is badly silted and not suitable for any but the smallest watercraft.)

**Bertie's** is a Bed and Breakfast with restaurant which is located about 1 kilometer away taking the left hand road at the cross-road intersection. Wood oven pizzas as well as yummy baked goods also available.

Several Saturday mornings the local **Douglas Harbour Community Centre** hosts a breakfast, inquire at Hunter's One Stop for the schedule of these community breakfasts.

Visiting club cruises are welcome and we will do whatever we can to accommodate your mooring/dockage needs as well as any other request you may have.

**Welcome** to all visitors to Douglas Harbour, whether you come by land or water. The wharf and associated facilities are owned by the Fredericton Yacht Club (FYC) <https://www.fyc.ca>.

Douglas Harbour is located on the north side of Grand Lake, about four miles northeast of the entrance to the lake from the Jemseg river. The harbour is a destination for boats visiting the Saint John River system, and also summer home of many boats from FYC. This beautiful harbour is considered one of the safest harbours in the area.

Douglas Harbour is also the summer home to a plethora of wildlife, including bald eagles, loons, ospreys, blue herons and other water fowl, deer, moose, beavers, monarch butterflies etc.



## Anchorage in Douglas Harbour as you enter from Grand Lake

- The “Bedroom”, on the right is a large and well protected mooring field, filled with private moorings.
- Cove to left which is also suitable for anchoring but there is a shallow bar to be respected.
- On the left side coming into the harbour boaters often “nose in” to the steep, sandy beach.
- For small and shallow draft vessels there is limited anchoring behind the sand bar on the left hand side of the wharf.

## FYC owned facilities available for visiting boaters:

### 1. The Wharf

- Coming into the wharf there is limited space for tying up along the front wharf face.
- The right hand side is for access to the self-serve sewer pump-out.
- Potable water from a hose bib is located in the same enclosure as the pump out. The water is tested and safe to drink although it has suspended minerals which may taint water tanks, use at your own discretion.
- The left hand side of the wharf is reserved for FYC club members unless specific arrangements have been made with the Douglas Harbour Rear Commodore.
- Dinghy dock on the left (west) side of wharf. (Dinghies should be locked and not left overnight).

### 2. Welcome Centre

- FYC owns the modest, but functional building, on the left hand side of the field with a screened in main room.
- Men’s and women’s washrooms and showers.

### 3. Garbage

- Limited garbage disposal is available for well bagged garbage in the small grey building (we encourage you to take as much garbage with you as possible).
- Recyclables should be placed in the recyclable barrel next to the grey building.

### 4. Moorings for rent

The club maintains nine guest moorings for nightly or weekly rental (recognizable as white balls with blue stripes):

- One located just off the west side of the wharf.
- Six moorings along the east side of the main harbour.
- Two moorings located in the “bedroom” (these moorings are for small boats).
