

Guidelines and Fees

Douglas Harbour is operated by volunteer members of the Fredericton Yacht Club, while you are welcome to enjoy the beauty of the harbour and use our facilities, we ask that you treat it with respect. To partially offset some of the cost of maintaining and operating the facility, the club has established modest fees for use of some of the facilities.

- FYC moorings are available at a nightly cost of **\$15.00 per day or \$75 per week** payable in cash at the box located in the Welcome building.



- Use of the pump out is on a self-serve basis.
- Instructions for its use are printed on the fence surrounding the pump-out. FYC fee of **\$10.00** payable at the cash box on the fence.
- There is also a suggested voluntary fee of **\$2.00** for the use of showers.
- **E-transfer available** see info on the wharf or Facebook page.

Other information

Harbour 1 Stop, a well-stocked convenience store is located half a kilometer from the wharf. Take the wharf road to the cross road intersection then turn right and walk for 250 meters. The store is on the right. This store has gas and diesel, basic foodstuff and other provisions, alcohol products, ice and ice cream as well as a small laundromat and take out stand. (The small creek which connects the harbour to the rear of the store is badly silted and only suitable for any the smallest watercraft.)

Bertie's café, restaurant open Thursday to Sunday 9 am to 8 pm, is located about 1 kilometer away taking the left hand road at the cross- road intersection. Wood oven pizzas are offered from 3 pm to 8 pm. To get pizza be sure to call ahead to place your order and reserve your pickup time. (506-385-2600) .

Scotchtown Farms Market is located about 2.7 kilometers after Berties'café. They offer home baked goods, crafts, seasonal local fruit and vegetables.

On several Saturday mornings the local **Douglas Harbour Hall Community Centre** hosts a pancake breakfast. Inquire at Harbour 1 Stop for the schedule.

DOUGLAS HARBOUR

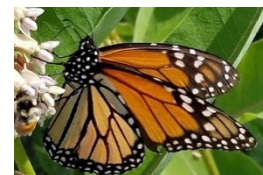


Whether you come by land or lake, all visitors are welcome at Douglas Harbour. The wharf and associated facilities are owned by the **Fredericton Yacht Club (FYC)**

Douglas Harbour is located on the north side of Grand Lake, about four miles northeast of the lake entrance from the Jemseg river. The harbour is a destination for boats visiting the Saint John River system and also a summer home for many boats from FYC. This beautiful harbour is considered one of the safest harbours in the area.

Douglas Harbour is also the summer home to a plethora of wildlife, including bald eagles, loons, ospreys, blue herons and other water fowl, deer, moose, beavers, monarch butterflies etc.



Anchorage in Douglas Harbour as you enter from Grand Lake

- The “Bedroom”, on the right is a large and well protected mooring field, filled with mostly private moorings.
- Cove to left is also suitable for anchoring but there is a shallow bar to be respected.
- On the left side coming into the harbour boaters often “nose in” to the steep, private sandy beach.



Welcome Centre

- FYC owns the modest, but functional building, on the left hand side of the approach road with a screened in main room.
- Men’s and women’s washrooms and showers are available for use.

The Wharf

- At the wharf there is limited space for tying up for a short time (less than an hour) along the front wharf face. All boats must not be left unattended.



- The right hand side is for access to the self-serve sewer pump-out.
- Potable water from a hose bib is located in the same enclosure as the pump out. The water is tested yearly and safe to drink although it has suspended minerals which may taint water tanks, use at your own discretion.
- The left (west) hand side of the wharf is reserved for FYC club members unless specific arrangements have been made with the Douglas Harbour Rear commodore.

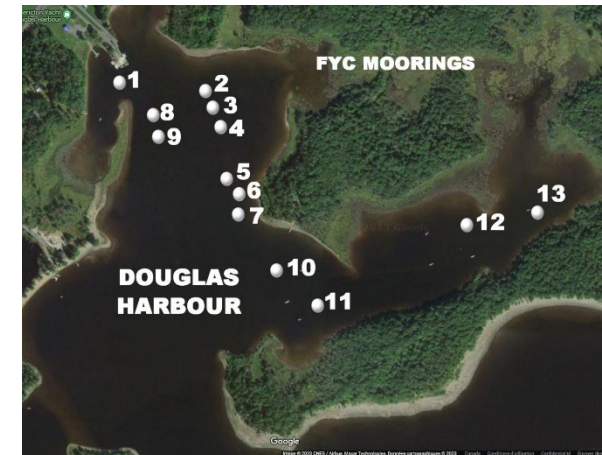


- Dinghy dock on the left (west) side of wharf. Can be used at your own risk.

Moorings for rent

The club maintains thirteen guest moorings for nightly or weekly rental :

- One located just off the west side of the wharf is used for short term 4 hrs. (1)
- Eight moorings along the east and west side of the approach channel. (2 to 9)
- Four moorings located in the “bedroom” (these moorings are for long-term rental). (10 to 13)



Garbage (beside Welcome Center)

- Limited garbage disposal is available for bagged garbage in the small grey building (we encourage you to take as much garbage with you as possible).
- Recyclables should be placed in the recyclable barrel next to the grey building.
